This letter responds to your March 23, 1999, and subsequent correspondence, submitted on behalf of  $\underline{X}$ , requesting a ruling under § 1362(b)(5) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The information submitted states that  $\underline{X}$  was incorporated on <u>D1</u>. <u>A</u> and <u>B</u>, the sole shareholders of <u>X</u>, intended that <u>X</u> elect to be an S corporation beginning Year 1, its first taxable year. <u>A</u>, as <u>X</u>'s president, represents that <u>X</u> relied on its attorney to file any necessary election in order for <u>X</u> to be an S corporation. However, <u>X</u>'s attorney believed that <u>X</u>'s in-house manager assumed responsibility for preparing a Form 2553, Election by a Small Business Corporation. Therefore, due to a miscommunication, a Form 2553 was not timely filed on behalf of <u>X</u> for Year 1. <u>X</u>'s minutes from its Board of Directors meeting indicate that <u>X</u> intended to be an S corporation beginning in Year 1. For Year 1, <u>X</u> filed Form 1120S, U.S. Income Tax Return for an S Corporation for <u>X</u>.

 $\underline{A}$  and  $\underline{B}$  agree to amend their tax returns consistent with the

treatment of  $\underline{X}$  as an S corporation for  $\underline{X}$ 's Year 1 taxable year.

Section 1362(b)(5) of the Code provides that if -- (A) an election under § 1362(a) is made for any taxable year after the date prescribed by § 1362(b) such election for such taxable year or no such election is made for any taxable year, and (B) the Secretary determines that there was reasonable cause for the failure to timely make such election, the Secretary may treat such an election as timely made for such taxable year.

Based solely on the facts and the representations submitted, we conclude that  $\underline{X}$  has established reasonable cause for failing to make a timely election to be an S corporation for  $\underline{X}$ 's first taxable year. Accordingly, provided that  $\underline{X}$  makes an election to be an S corporation by filing a completed Form 2553 with the appropriate service center effective for its Year 1 taxable year, within 60 days following the date of this letter, then such election will be treated as timely made for  $\underline{X}$ 's Year 1 taxable year. A copy of this letter should be attached to the Form 2553.

Except as specifically set forth above, no opinion is expressed concerning the federal tax consequences of the facts described above under any other provision of the Code, including whether  $\underline{X}$  was or is a small business corporation under § 1361(b) of the Code.

This ruling is directed only to the taxpayer who requested it. Section 6110(k)(3) of the Code provides that it may not be used or cited as precedent.

Pursuant to a power of attorney on file with this office, a copy of this letter is being sent to  $\underline{X}$  and  $\underline{X}$ 's other authorized representative.
